Report on Romania Trip

It was a wonderful time of work, fellowship, and worship as believers from different nations — Americans, Ukrainians, Hungarians, Serbians, and Romanians — came together to advance God's work at the camp center. It is a true blessing to be part of such a diverse group of believers, all united by a common purpose.

Despite being slightly short-handed for the two major projects planned, tremendous help was received from the local churches. Together, both tasks were nearly completed, and the remaining work will be finalized by Romanian partners over the next couple of weekends.

Another significant initiative was set in motion during this trip — a plan to replace the roof of an old, unused church building in a nearby village. Although there are not enough Christians in the area to sustain weekly services, there is hope that the building can be purchased and renovated into a home for a needy family in the future, perhaps even by next year.

One of the most powerful aspects of the trip was the joy of worshiping together. Participation in five different services provided an indescribable fellowship experience. This highlight of the journey reinforced the importance of coming together as one body in Christ.

Throughout the time in Romania, various churches were visited, joining in Sunday services and revival meetings. The encouragement and hospitality of the local believers have been a tremendous blessing.

Work Projects in Romania

At the camp center, two primary projects were the focus:

- **Indoor Project:** Construction of boys' and girls' bathrooms to ensure they are ready for use when the camp opens.
- **Outdoor Project:** Erecting a steel structure to provide much-needed protection from the sun and rain during the extremely hot summer days, particularly for youth camps. The support and involvement of church families have been deeply encouraging, reinforcing the importance of this mission. It is inspiring to witness how God is using these efforts to strengthen the fellowship in Romania.

A Legacy of Faithful Service

The work in Romania was originally initiated by Clark and Sue Phillips in the 1990s with the support of FCFI. They established a 150-cow dairy farm to help fund an orphanage. Over the years, the focus has shifted toward evangelism, helping churches, and developing a camp ministry center. While the physical work has evolved, the core mission remains the same—introducing people to Jesus Christ and helping them grow in their faith.

Encouragement from Wisconsin

Returning from a 20th (or possibly 21st) trip to Romania, there is great encouragement from the work being done, both abroad and at home (ministry and farming both). In southern Wisconsin, spring is in process. The winter cover crops are now greening up, a reminder of the new season ahead. Farmers are always filled with anticipation and excitement as spring arrives each year.

Reports of early shows and FFA conventions already taking place this year are also heartening. The hope is that many people will come to know Jesus as they hear the message of salvation.

The mission field is not just overseas—it includes local communities as well. This spring, let there be intentionality in sharing Christ's love with those nearby. That is the true calling at FCFI. May the seeds of faith be planted to bring a great harvest for the Lord. Thank you for your faithfulness, and trust in God for a bountiful harvest, both in the fields and at the shows in 2025.

The Watchman's Call: A Biblical Mandate for Action

In Ezekiel 33:8, God warns the prophet that if he sees danger coming but does not warn the people, their destruction will be on his hands. This sobering message is a reminder that inaction—failing to speak or act when we see a need—is just as serious as outright wrongdoing.

Today, commodity farmers may lose money farming and both urban/rural communities and churches witness growing economic hardships and spiritual hunger, we cannot stand by and continue in the same rut. There are families in urban areas yearning for a new life, for the dignity of work, and the opportunity to build something lasting. In these cases, we are guilty of the same sin of omission Ezekiel warns about if we do nothing.

The good news is that we have an opportunity to respond—to create a movement with a new Acts 4:34 model (not talking about socialism) where farmers and churches partner to provide land, mentorship, and cooperative farming enterprises that start with families

that want to move out to the farm (at first temporary dwellings such as yurts) and then expand through these entrepreneurs to assistance to urban poor for work (even urban church incubator kitchens or on farm processing or gleaning). By opening our farms to those seeking a fresh start, we not only expand ministry but also build economic resilience by increasingly moving from low-value commodity crops to high-value crops. This isn't just about charity; it's about discipleship, responsibility, and creating a sustained expansion future for both farm families and those seeking or needing transformation. There may be other alternatives to the current context of farming away equity or riding it out, hoping for better prices in the future (the 80s). We need to have this discussion and plan with excellence.

Who will answer the call? This is the right time to start a movement like the 2nd Great Awakening Revival, and it can start on the farms with a renewed sense of responsibility toward ministry and include bringing youth to the farm, such as father-son and mother-daughter events. Mal. 4:5-6 "...and he will turn the hearts of the children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction." My programmer friend and I are attempting to provide a solution with "**Farm Planner**", a program where the Great Commission ministry is front and center of the plan. Leaving It All on the Field for Christ

In sports, there's a powerful phrase: "Leave everything on the field." It means giving your all—your strength, energy, and passion—so that when the game is over, you can say with confidence, "I gave it everything I had."

As believers, that's exactly the mindset we need when it comes to sharing the Gospel. When Jesus returns, we should be able to say, "I left everything on the field." That we used every ounce of our strength, every resource, and every opportunity to bring the Good News to a world in desperate need—because there's no greater cause than this.

It's this mission that drives me across the country, reaching young people for Christ. Lives Are Being Transformed

Our first FFA state convention of the year took place in Logan, Utah, on March 13-14 under the leadership of area leader Mike Weaver. A vendor stationed next to our booth was amazed at the students' attentiveness, noting how intently they listened to the Words of Life as Mike shared the Gospel.

This hunger for truth isn't just in Utah. At farm shows in Sioux Falls, Des Moines, Louisville, and Kansas City, I've witnessed FFA students leaning in, eager to hear the Good News. It's an encouraging sign as we gear up for FFA state conventions across the country this spring and summer.

Your prayers and support are making an eternal difference.

Take, for example, a young FFA girl from Minnesota. Last year, she visited our booth at the Sioux Falls farm show, where we shared the Gospel with her. Months later, at a summer camp, she gave her life to Christ. Now, she's on fire for Jesus! We planted and watered the seed, and harvest came at the summer at a Christian camp.

Eternal Impact

We've had the privilege of praying with many students as they surrender their lives to Christ, witnessing their countenance light up with newfound joy and peace. Even more incredible is reconnecting with students a year later—young people who once prayed with us and are now thriving in their faith, attending youth groups, reading their Bibles, and boldly living for Jesus.

Every conversation, every prayer, every seed planted matters.

And we couldn't do it without you.
